

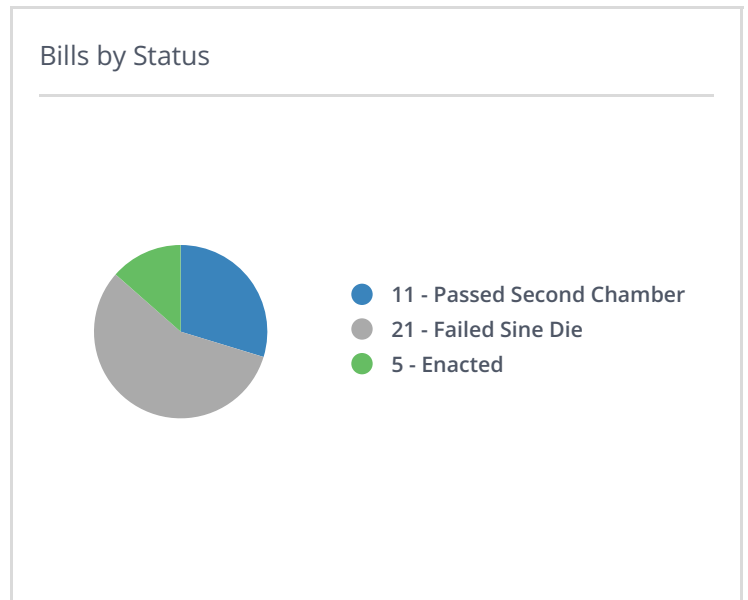
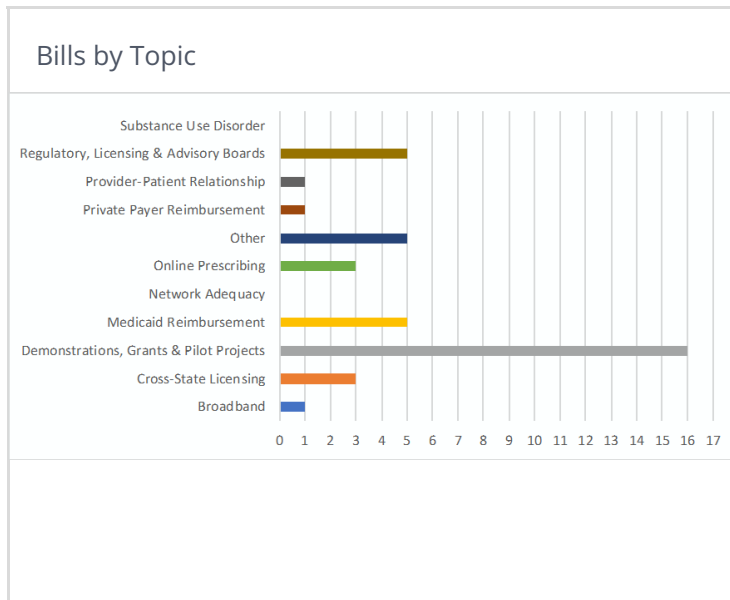
TexLa Telehealth Resource Center - May 2019
